

Future Producers

Fidget Feet are excited to announce Future Producers, a 2-month producer training opportunity. In partnership with the National Circus Festival of Ireland, Loosymokes, Kath Gorman of Promenade, and Kevin Wratten of Split Second (UK), from early June until late July. Funded by the Arts Council's Capacity Building Support Scheme.

We are seeking 3 individuals who already have some administration, project management or producing experience and are seeking a next step in their professional development as a producer/towards being a producer. In particular, we are looking for people who are interested in upskilling in the speciality of Circus, Street Arts and Spectacle producing.

The training will take 16 days, a mix of in-person (at the Irish Aerial Creation Centre in Limerick and the Irish Aerial Dance Festival in Donegal) and online. It will involve a combination of training activities, coaching, and mentoring, including looking at real-life project examples and the work of the partner organisations. The final 2 days will take place at Fidget Feet's Irish Aerial Dance Festival in Donegal alongside Fidget Feet's 25-year celebrations and include some industry networking. After the training, participants will be paired with either Fidget Feet, NCFI, or Loosymokes for one week of paid work experience. The end of the project will take place at the *National Circus Festival of Ireland*

Programme supports

Participants will receive a €90 fee per day for the training days and a €500 fee for their week of work experience. Accommodation, travel expenses and per diems have also been allocated and participants would be responsible to work within the budget.

For individuals who have specific needs, we will work to ensure you have the facilities in place for any work needing to be carried out online whether that is the interview or the training programme itself. We also work to create a more inclusive environment with targeted support for those that need assistance in certain areas so that you can fully participate in the training programme.

The Irish Aerial Creation Centre is an accessible ground floor location with an accessible toilet near the building's entrance and a wheelchair-access ramp at the entrance of the building.

Irish Aerial Dance Festival takes place at Aura Leisure Centre, Letterkenny and An Grianán Theatre in Letterkenny. An Grianán Theatre has accessible toilet facilities in the lower foyer area with two lifts in the venue. Aura Arena, Letterkenny is wheelchair accessible with accessible toilets in the member service area.

Future Producers - areas covered

The Future Producers training will offer hands-on training and mentorships tackling some of the key jobs a producer would undertake, while also offering an opportunity for peer-to-peer support.

Areas covered include:

- Getting a project off the ground/where do you begin?
- Communication the project's vision and ensuring everyone is on the same page
- Working with artists - establishing and maintaining good relationships
- Sounding board for the artistic/creative team
- Planning, scheduling and logistics
- Fundraising, grant applications, sponsorship etc
- Finance and budgeting
- Marketing and communications
- Insurance, ensuring legal compliance and appropriate policies are in place
- Contracts, copyright etc
- Ideas development
- Partnership development including other collaborators
- Recruitment and management of non-creative team members, e.g. production manager, PR etc
- Site/venue scouting and tour booking

Fidget Feet

Since 1998, Fidget Feet have created, established, and nurtured the aerial dance sector in Ireland. This year marks Fidget Feet's 25th year and House is a big part of the 25-year celebrations. Having created and toured over 35 shows, both indoor and outdoor over the past 25 years. Fidget Feet has established itself as a leader, a creator, a performer and a trainer of aerial arts and circus in Ireland.

Loosymokes

Loosymokes is an award-winning modern Circus company that seeks to create synesthetic spectacles that swallow an audience. The company is made up of a close-knit group of hardworking artists, craftspeople and performers produced by Elaine Mc Cague and Jonah McGreevy and is a unique combination of circus, spectacle, dance, theatre and visual art. Working with the shapes of waking dreams, the glimpses at the edges of eyesight, and the intensity of lightning struck they aim to create a visceral experience that ends deep in the gut of the viewer. Their two major works to date Behind the Dark and Raven Eyed have both received five star-reviews, toured to sold-out audiences, and been nominated for multiple awards.

Promenade
